Fostering Independence

Encourage a "can do" mastery attitude to learning.	Encourage children to make decisions for themselves. Stand back and give them space to solve their own problems.
Help children to develop their own possible explanations for events and the strategies to find out further information.	"What do you think is going to happen to the caterpillar? shall we find a book about caterpillars?".
Encourage children to tell others about their own experiences (helping the consolidation process).	"Oh lovely you went to London at the weekend".
Help children make connections between what they are doing and previous learning	"Do you remember when we read the Christmas story yesterday?".
Raise children's self-esteem.	Encourage children to support younger / less able peers.
Decrease the levels of support given	As children become more competent start to take away the building blocks and encourage their independence.
